Selected candidates will receive dedicated support from UNIBG's supervisor and International Team of the Scientific Research Office to write a successful proposal and to follow the application for submission to the EC.

Marie Skłodowska Curie Action Funding Scheme and Eligibility Criteria

The MSCA scheme offers the opportunity for the best and most promising post-doctoral researchers to come to Italy to work with a supervisor for at least 12 months. The grant provides an allowance to cover your living, travel and family costs as well as research and networking costs in line with MSCA scheme rates. Please note that according to the Marie Skłodowska-Curie mobility rule, the applicant must not have resided or carried out his/her main activity in Italy:

- for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately before the call deadline (14 September 2017) for MSCA-IF-EF-ST Standard European Fellowships and MSCA-IF-GF Global Fellowships;
- for more than 12 months in the 5 years immediately before the call deadline for MSCA-IF-EF-CAR Career Restart panel, MSCA-IF-EF-RI Reintegration panel and MSCA-IF-EF-SE Society and Enterprise panel.
